Preface.

This book contains a selection of hymn texts from the interdenominational Apostolisches Liederbuch, first published in German language. The book is intended to build musical bridges of mutual understanding, and gives you the opportunity to use, today, the past for building a better tomorrow, following the motto of Apostolic History Network (Netzwerk Apostolische Geschichte e. V.), a registered charity in Germany, dedicated to researching Apostolic church history.

The book has been organized much like a small hymnal, and the songs contained herein are being sung in many different churches and congregations, hence, it is a useful tool: for spontaneous collective singing; also for ecumenical meetings; youth gatherings; Christmas events with the congregation; and for many more occasions. The appendix includes a proposal for a prayer gathering from our Apostolic tradition that can be celebrated together.

The songs were selected from the most popular German hymns contained within the various German-language Apostolic sources. For this reason, the selection will not be matching precisely all the popular songs in other languages. We still hope you will enjoy this book. Next to every hymn you will find references to the various German-language books that contain this specific song.

For the Apostolisches Liederbuch, an official accompaniment book for organ has been published containing music and all German lyrics (ISBN 978-3-939291-14-5, 24,90 \in). You may use the accompaniment books of the churches, as well, and use the respective reference number next to the song as cross-reference, provided that the respective number has not been put into brackets, which indicate incompatibility between the melodies in the books. There also is a sturdy-bound melody version of the Liederbuch in German that can be ordered at your favourite bookseller (ISBN 978-3-939291-12-1, 9,90 \in). And we have also published a very low-priced paperback version only containing the German part of this book (ISBN 978-3-939291-13-8, 2,90 \in).

We hope that you will have much joy and pleasure singing, making music and confessing together! And if you don't really know where to start, have a look at the very last page of this English part (in the middle of the book)...
